- 2. Why did radicals continue to use the 'constitutionalist idiom' in their rhetoric and publications? You may answer this question with reference to the 1790s and/or the 1810s.
- 3. To what extent did the French Revolution impede the movement for parliamentary reform within the British parliament?
- 4. What were the causes of the Irish Rebellion of 1798, which cause played the largest part and why?
- 5. To what extent did William Pitt the Younger and his supporters in parliament undertake a 'u-turn' in relation to parliamentary reform in the 1790s?
- 6. Examine the ideas and the political leadership of one or more of the following individuals: Major John Cartwright, John Thelwall, Charles James Fox, Henry Hunt.
- 7. What were the causes and consequences of the 'Peterloo Massacre' of 1819?
- 8. How unusual was Georgiana, Duchess of Devonshire, in the extent of her political activities as a woman?
